Role purpose

To oversee the club's health and safety responsibilities and ensure we meet our duty of care to members, volunteers, and visitors. The Health and Safety Coordinator plays a key role in implementing policies, managing risks, and promoting a safe environment for all club activities.

Responsibilities

- Help to ensure the club fulfils its responsibilities for the health and safety of its members
- Implement and regularly review the club's Health and Safety Policy
- Oversee the implementation of strategies outlined in the Health and Safety Policy
- Identify, assess, and manage hazards through regular risk assessments
- Ensure all club members and stakeholders are aware of health and safety procedures and guidance
- Act as the first point of contact for health and safety concerns
- Implement and maintain health and safety reporting and recording procedures
- Maintain up-to-date emergency contact information
- Report health and safety issues to the Committee on a regular basis
- Coordinate first aid training for coaches and volunteers
- Maintain first aid kits and oversee accident reporting
- Plan for handover or succession of the role
- Declare and manage any personal conflicts of interest
